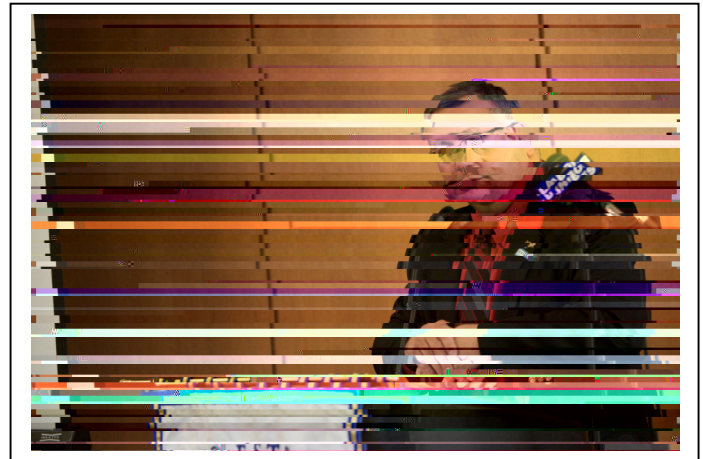
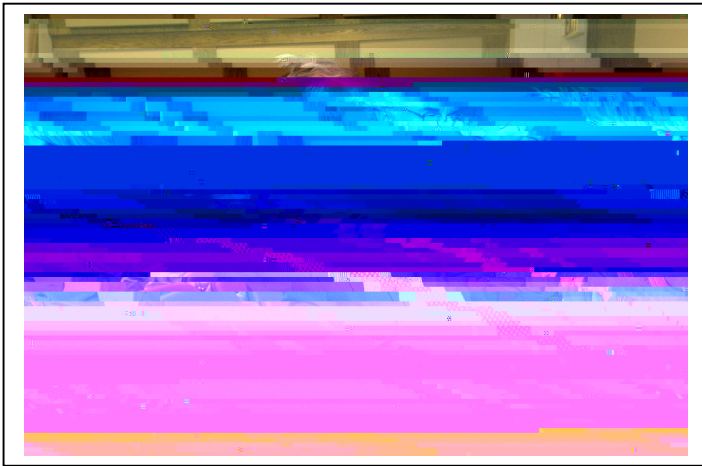




3. Joanna Grossman, Professor and Associate Dean at Hofstra Law School, spoke on April 22nd as part of Hofstra's annual "Pay Equity Day." Prof. Grossmann critiqued the Supreme Court's "Lily Ledbetter Decision" as a narrow ruling that created unreasonable obstacles to employees seeking protection from pay discrimination. Nine months later, in one of his first acts in office, President Obama signed the Lily Ledbetter Fair Pay Act to remove such obstacles. Her talk was organized by CLD and Hofstra's Labor Studies Program.

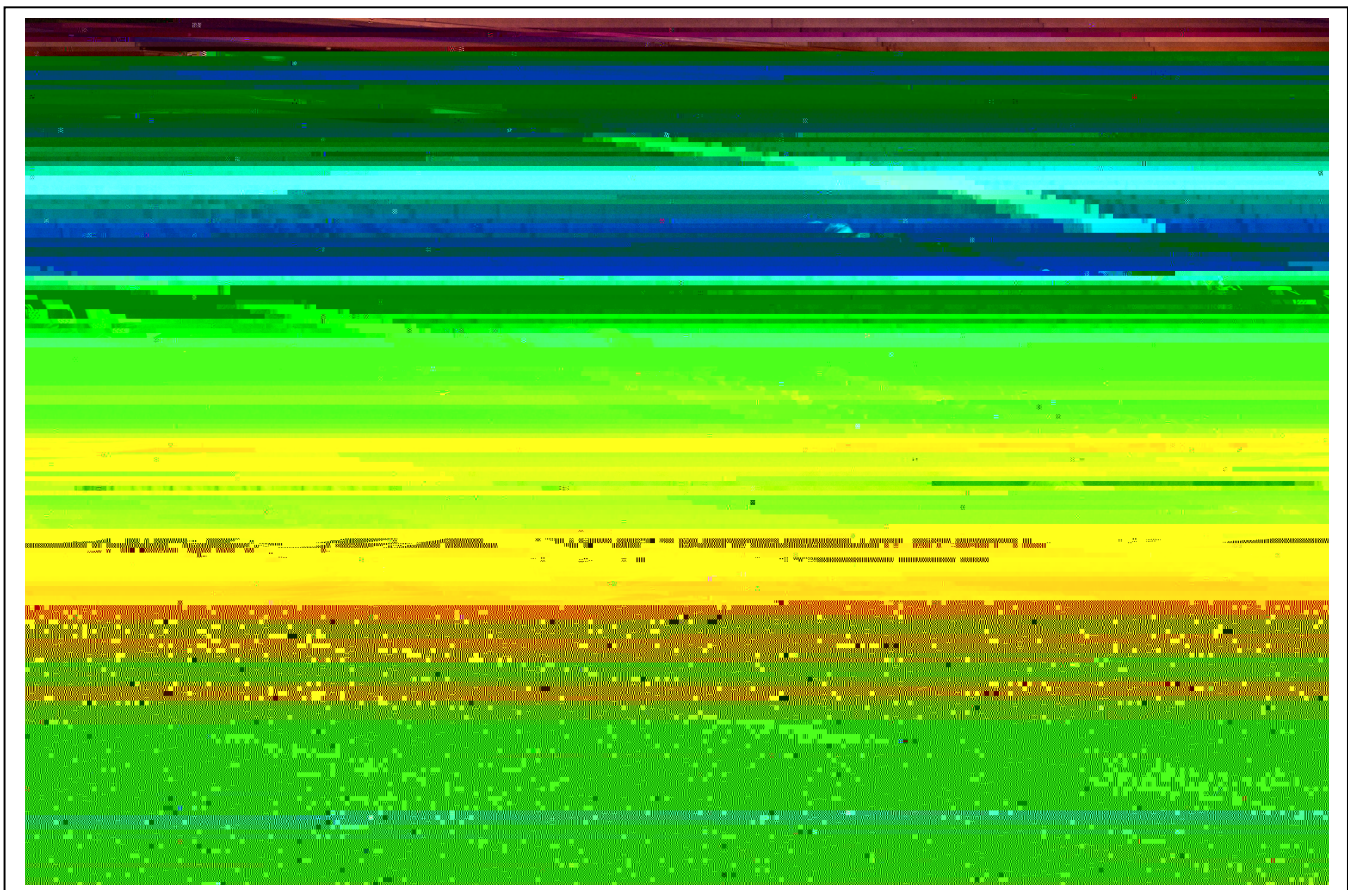
