The student must submit a letter to the committee detailing the selecting a chair from among its faculty members, the committe and any other itmesses it deems releasn to appear before it an committee it not disclose to the student the grades of other information it deems prize. 1.A demonstrated bias by the instructor is reflected in the grade 2. The students final grade is inconsistent it the other grades he cannot be justified by other pedagogical considerations.
