- i. Joe Barkwill is Vp and Dom Lavin is in charge of campus operations! We do all the new construction, maintenance, grounds, public safety and the list goes on! Anything that is non-academic. Some of the things that are going on include the new building (which is scheduled to be completed in June for opening in September, it is both the engineering and nursing building), the new lot, Hagerdorn is being renovated to build labs for a new PT program, November 11th Basketball game, we renovated the patio for Bits, we have the interfaith and the back of bits on our radar as well, 30 clocks have been purchased and need homes, ADA panels, elevators are being looked at, and we have the master plan of the student. This plan has had a lot of conversations about this. We are looking to renovate our towers, our quads, opening more seating areas, if there are any areas on campus that you would like to see outdoor seating please reach out! The library had contractors in it today and we are planning on working on the outside and the windows! Walter is back!
 1. Senator Siegel: What will be replacing the turnstiles? And I know you are currently in charge of the contract of dining, I know the

campus. We have a new Provost, and we are currently looking and giving a list of classrooms that need to have priority in renovating. We are working on a grant in order to receive money to update our classrooms- it's expensive. What are we planning? We want all new flooring, universal design on the furniture, new ceilings and lighting- all of which will give faculty flexibility on setting up their classrooms. We also have to work with the registrar to make sure we can still have enough seating within the classrooms with this new universal design. We are focusing on some of these older buildings. We are having a faculty committee to also discuss technology within the classrooms, and we want their input on the design of the classrooms.

 1. Senator Egolf: I think there are mixed opinions on SGA compensation and I think it should be a joint conversation with other leaders but not the entire population of the school. I think this should be a step system in a way, and should be discussed further amongst our group as well as our Student Leaders who would be a part of this initiative.
 2. Chair Atlas: To reference a previous speaker, I think there should be a concrete discussion on the compensation. I do what to point out that the clock question

- a. Senator Greenlaw: I think it would be better to gauge internal opinion before student body
- b. Chair Jackson: I do believe the compensation point is a needed point but I do not want the senators to feel blindsided by a decision. We could do separate surveys.
- c. Chair Boothe: I also agree with previous speakers and I believe it should be talked about internally before it goes externally. I do know you have a student activity fee question and I believe that this would be more appropriate to put in at this point
- d. Chair Giovannello: I think there should be more cohesiveness within SGA and I believe that this should be done before we move forward.
- e. Senator Tauro: As a senator, I do feel out of the loop and I do believe that we should also be able to be a part of this conversation. As for question 9, I believe the data is still important
- f. Chair Anniballi: I believe there is a happy middle, with asking about the student activity, “Would you support an increase in the student activity fee to fund student engagement?”. Something like this could be a good middle ground with this.

 - i. Comptroller Fountain: I understand the feelings of being out of the loop but we are very much at the beginning of this resolution. I want this student to be more in general as RHA, SGA, do not have compensation but also RAs who need more compensation. There are multiple resolutions coming.
 - 1. Senator Seigel: I don't want to pay anymore money.
- h. Chair DeCrescenzo: It is unfair to assume everyone knows about this but I think we should make that clear

- i. Chair Staderker: I think it would be more valuable to have a Public safety question.
- j. Senator Egolf: I think we should need a lot more discussion about this but I believe the things regarding financials can be a separate survey.

 - ii. Comptroller Fountain: It would be a very broad language right now to include all clubs and all leaders on campus.

 - b. Against Senator Egolf: I can see how there can be vagueness but I do feel that having “other” is there for the people that do not relate to the other options that are specifically laid out. It is better to have a vague yes than to have one say no because there isn’t an option for them.

 - c. For Chair Giovannangelo: It is vague and we can't really determine from the data that it is. Vagueness will signal there is more to look at and we may have missed something.

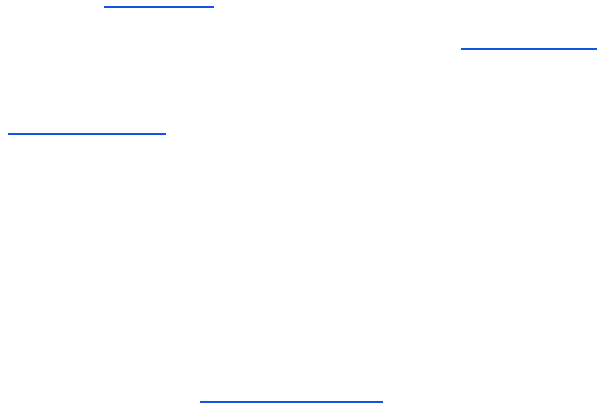

my passions is to pay that forward and at Hofstra I want to make your academic experience enriching. As SGA you all believe in helping and serving other students. I went through some of the same experiences as you during my time in college as a student athlete and RA. I want to be able to ensure this for our students here as well. The opportunities we have shape us and really help us become who we are. Now at Hofstra there is a lot of change including myself as Provost. My responsibilities are that the academic programs are robust and welcoming and that we innovate the classroom experience. I work with the departments to ensure opportunities for students. We are currently working hard about the future of Hofstra and what the student experience will be like. We want to learn more about what's special about Hofstra and learn from others who are potential new students, and what does it mean to graduate from Hofstra and be engaged and vital leaders in our community. By 2035, the jobs that will exist have not been created yet, and that will also be when Hofstra celebrates its 100 year anniversary.
